Dear Parishioner,

This Sunday's Gospel (John 12:20-33) invites us to let go of the things that hold us back from living fully in Christ. Like the grain of wheat, true life and abundance come through sacrifice. Jesus shows us that worldly glory and clinging to this life aren't the paths to fulfilment. Instead, by embracing God's will, even when it means difficulty, we find freedom and bear lasting fruit. This Lent, let's ask ourselves: what do we need to surrender to discover the deeper life Christ offers? May we be open to dying to ourselves so that we can truly live in Him.

How Can We Speak about God?


[please read Catechism of the Catholic Church - no 39-43]

Talking about God is important! The Church believes everyone can understand something about God, which is why we should have conversations with all kinds of people about Him. But here's the tricky part: God is way bigger and more amazing than anything we can imagine. Our words are limited!

Think of describing the most beautiful sunset. You'll use things like colours and shapes, but the real sunset is more incredible than your words. It's the same with God.

We use things we understand, like goodness and beauty, to point towards Him. These things are like tiny reflections of God's greatness.

However, we need to be careful. We can't make God fit into a box with our words. He is always more mysterious and surprising than we can say!



Reflection:

- What are some words you use to describe God? (Loving, powerful, kind, etc)
- Can you think of something beautiful or awe-inspiring that reminds you of God's greatness?

Questions to Discuss

- Why is it important to talk about God with people who believe different things?
 - How can art, music, or nature help us express things about God?
- Even though God is beyond our words, why is it still important to try to describe Him?

Bible Verses

- "For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made." (Romans 1:20)
- "Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways!" (Romans 11:33)
